However, although any information you provide will be treated as privileged as against third parties, such information may be disclosed to the Company. Any communications made during the course of our relationship with you, your family members, or the Company may not be subject to a claim of attorney-client privilege in a civil proceeding between you and the Company. At present, we are not aware of any potential or actual conflict of interest; however, it is possible that at some future time your interests could come into conflict with the interests of the Company; and in consenting to joint representation, you expressly waive any such conflict.
