**Instructions**

Exam: We examined the following vital systems in your pet today: General Appearance, Eyes, Ears, Respiratory System, Abdomen, Skin, Musculoskeletal System, Circulatory System, Urinary & Reproductive Systems. We also examined your pet's Mouth, Teeth and Gums to determine whether a Professional Cleaning or other dental procedure needed to be performed. A disease-free mouth is a key factor in helping your pet live a long, healthy life.

Owners are responsible for the cost of any recheck exams.

We recommend that all cats and dogs be microchipped and have name tags on at all times.

Buprenex injectable: This medication is an injectable opiate used for mild to moderate pain. This injection will last about 6 hours. If you are taking your pet home, additional pain medications may be needed for further management of pain. Some mild sedation and mild respiratory depression may occur.

Buprenex oral: This medication is an injectable opiate used for mild to moderate pain, but has been found to work if absorbed buccally or by the mucous membranes. The most common side effect is some mild sedation and respiratory depression. This medication can be given up to three times a day for pain management.

Elizabethan Collar: The collar will help prevent your pet from bothering the area and delaying the healing process. Try to keep the collar as clean and dry as possible. Keep a watchful eye on your pet the next 2-3 days until he/she gets used to wearing it.
